The Archery Hall of Fame's 26th induction was held April 7th in Rochester, Minnesota, in conjunction with Pope and Young's 50th Anniversary Celebration.

Archery Hall of Fame President, M. R. James, welcomed all and introduced those Hall of Famers present for the occasion.

A sell-out crowd watched as G. Fred Asbell joined his peers to become the 66th member to be inducted into the Archery Hall of Fame. Will "Chief" Compton was inducted posthumously and became the 67th person to join those who came before him. Mary

THE POPE AND YOUNG CLUB/ST. **CHARLES** MU-SEUM located just off I-90 south of Rochester, Minnesota, is probably one of our sport's best-kept secrets. Fortunately, the word is finally getting out as more folks discover this amazing repository of archery and bowhunting history. It's

no hyperbolic exaggeration to say the facility is home to the largest collection of archery and bowhunting memorabilia and artifacts to be found anywhere.

If you've not yet dropped by, add a visit to your must-see bucket list. If you've already made a tour, you'll probably want to stop by again. A single tour simply can't do justice to properly viewing the thousands of bows, arrows, broadheads or impressive big game mounts of North America's big game species. Additionally, there are informational storyboards and dioramas spotlighting five pioneers of the sport,

all of whom are Archery Hall of Fame members: Dr. Saxton Pope, Art Young, Ishi, Fred Bear, and Glenn St. Charles. There's also an extensive research library of archery and bowhunting books, magazines, catalogs, and other periodicals dating back to the 1800s.

Of special interest to readers of this newsletter is the up-to-date text-and-photo "Wall of Fame" display featuring all AHOF inductees, plus a traveling exhibit featuring items from the Archery Hall of Fame's own collection of historical items, including one of Geronimo's bows. In turn,

a Pope and Young Club/St. Charles Museum display will be included in the AHOF's new home at Bass Pro Shops' facility in Springfield, Missouri.

For the record, the Pope & Young Museum is located at Club headquarters in Chatfield. Hours are 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays. Admission is free. As Pope & Young founder Glenn St. Charles would say, "Such a deal!"

OUR EARLY APRIL Board of Directors' meeting was both busy and productive. My personal thanks go out to the officers and board members who took time from their busy personal and professional lives to attend.
